This online shopping behemoth will deliver anything to your door – even some things you'd given up on finding in Beijing. There's just one catch: Taobao is a Chinese-language website, which means most expats are scared of it. So much so that an entire industry of "Taobao agents" has sprung up to deal with the hassle on your behalf, but they'll charge you a percentage – and anyway, what's there to be scared of? You made it to Beijing, didn't you? Take a deep breath and set off on an adventure that will revolutionize the way you shop. (And remember that resolution you made to improve your Chinese? Taobao will help with that too.) Class is now in session.

SHOES IN BIG SIZES


ENGLISH-LANGUAGE MAGAZINES



irst of all, this is not meant to be an exhaustive guide to navigating Taobao. For that, you should turn to **Taobaofieldguide.com**, an invaluable resource that walks you through the entire process. What we've done is to supplement their guide with a few updated screenshots – and to offer some additional tips.







THE HAND-OFF

Special note for COD deliveries: When the item is delivered, check the product in the courier's presence. If it's fine, pay the courier the delivery fee + 3% surcharge. If the product does not match the description, you can refuse to accept it by not signing for the item.

CRIB SHEET: USEFUL PHRASES

Offers authentic cosmetics brands (including well-known European labels) at incredibly cheap prices. The best part about this Hong Kong-based beauty chain is that the website is in both English and Chinese. In addition, once you spend more than HKD_75, you'll get free

shipping. There's a 30-day return and exchange policy.

www.newegg.com.cn Payment: COD and Alipay

The one-stop shop for all of your elecrronic needs. Just type in the brand and product number in the search ield to find the item you're looking for. All electronic products come with a warranty.

www.kudipets.com Payment: COD

An online store devoted to pet food, nutrition, grooming products, toys, and other pet-related miscellany. Note: The text and photos on the page are really small, which can make searching for products a tricky task.

www.wodexiangce.cn Payment: COD and Alipay

Upload your photos here and get them printed. RMB 0.35 per print – it doesn't get any cheaper than that. Shoppers can also personalize mugs, T-shirts, postcards, calendars, bags and paintings with their own photos and images.

www.misnono.com Payment: COD and Alipay

Rival Schools

Browse and buy top-drawer lingerie – sheer and satiny pieces made of premium silk, chiffon, French lace, organic cotton and microfiber. Based in Beijing, they offer same-day delivery and a "try at home" service, where a personal shopper makes a house call with a selection of items, if you're into that.

Of course, there are other shopping websites that hope to challeng Taobao's supremacy as King of the One-Stop Shop ...

www.eachnet.com Payment: Anfutong; some sellers offer COD

Eachnet is Taobao's biggest competitor on certain items, it offers prices that are even cheaper than its counterpart. The two have many similarities including the search method but Eachnet has its very own payment tool, Anfutong Since most stores are run by individual sellers, the quality and authenticity of products can be a little dicey sometimes. Customers should care fully vet photos and product details before placing an order. We suggest customers choose products with both a return and cash-on-delivery policy.

www.dangdang.com Payment: COD and Alipay

Thousands of products including books, magazines, music, DVDs, software, clothing and skin care at competitive prices. Registration and searches are easy and straightforward. The site helps customers keep track of shipping with e-mails reporting the packages' delivery status. The delivery fee is RMB 5 and goods arrive in 1-2 days. Any order over RMB 29 earns free delivery.

www.amazon.cn Payment: COD and Alipay

The Chinese branch of the online shopping behemoth stocks a similar line of books, magazines, music, software and gadgetry. Once the order is confirmed, customers can track their order and its delivery status on the site. Typing in English keywords works when searching for English-language publications.
